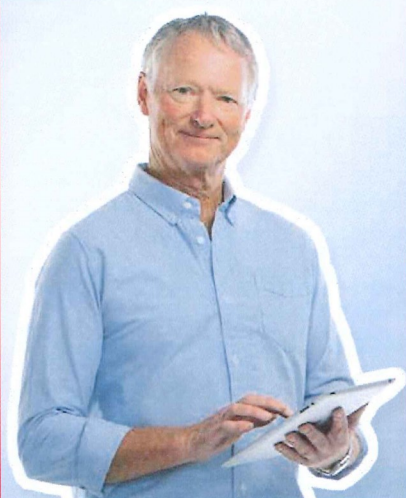

What is a school board of trustees?

Every state and state-integrated school in New Zealand has a board of trustees.

School board membership includes elected parent representatives, an elected staff representative and the principal. If the school has students above year 9, the board also includes a student representative.

What do trustees do?

First and foremost a board is accountable for student progress and achievement to its parents and community. The board has the overall responsibility for the school. This includes legal obligations covering curriculum, property, personnel, finance and health and safety.

Here are some specific things the board does:

- Sets the strategic direction and long-term plans for the school and monitors the board's progress against them.
- Monitors and evaluates student progress and achievement.
- Oversees the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.
- Ensures that the educational needs and aspirations of Māori learners, Pasifika learners and learners with special education needs are identified, planned for and met.
- Fulfills the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.
- Appoints and supports the principal and assesses their performance.

What skills do trustees need?

Trustees are active leaders in their schools and need to work well in a team, ask challenging questions and have good communications skills. Boards need a balance of skills and experiences to ensure effective processes for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing the school's performance are in place. Who can become a trustee?

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can be nominated for election to a school board. Your school will be happy to help you find out more about standing for election or nominating someone else.

How is a board elected?

The school staff and parents elect boards of trustees every three years.

All parents of students who are enrolled full-time in a state or state-integrated school can and should vote in the elections for parent representatives.

What help do school trustees get?

New Zealand School Trustees Association, through a Ministry of Education contract, provides free employment and governance advice, support and resources. NZSTA also provides a variety of professional development opportunities for trustees.

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O le ā le komiti faafoe?

O a'oga uma lava i Niu Sila e aofia ai soo se itū'aiga a'oga, e iai a latou komiti faafoe.

O komiti faafoe a a'oga e aofia ai sui filifiliga o matua, o le sui filifiliga o faia'oga ma le pulea'oga. Afai o le a'oga e iai vasega i luga a'e o le Tausaga 9, e filifiliga foi le sui o tamaiti a'oga.

O a matāfaioi a le komiti faafoe?

O le pito lā'au pito i sila ona tāua a le Komiti faafoe, o le māta'itūina lea o le aga'i i luma ma le si'itia o le tulaga o a'oa'oga a le fanau ma feso'ota'i ma matua ma tagata lautele. O la latou matāfaioi o le vaai lea o le a'oga atoa i lona faatinoina ina ia tusa ai ma le tulafono e aofia ai le faatinoina o le Taiala mo a'oa'oga, falea'oga ma mea tōtino a le a'oga, tagata faigaluega, tupe, ma le māta'itūina o le ola maloloina ma le saogalemu.

O nisi nei o vaega faapitoa o matāfaioi a Komiti faafoe:

- Faatulaga fuafuaga mamao mo le a'oga, ma māta'itū le faatauunuiina o tiute o tagata ta'ito'atasi o ia fuafuaga.
- Māta'itū ma iloilo ina le aga'i i luma o le taumafai o fanau.
- Māta'itū le faatutaina o tagata faigaluega, fales'oga, tupe, faatinoina o le ta'iala mo a'oa'oga, ma le faamaumauina.
- Mautinoa o mana'oga o tamaiti Māori, tamaiti Pasefika ma tamaiti e iai o latou mana'oga faapitoa, oloo māta'itūina, ma fuafuaina ni polokalame e faamalietia ai o latou mana'oga.
- Faamautūina le autū o le Treaty o Waitangi i le amana'iaina ma le faatutaina ina ia atagia ai tu ma aganuu a Niu Sila.
- Filifiliga ma lagolago pulea'oga ma Iloilo le faatinoina o latou tiute.

O a tomiai e mana'omia e sui o le komiti faafoe?

O tomiai o sui o komiti faafoe e mana'omia le avea lea ma ta'ita'i mata'alia i totonu o a'oga, e fiafia e gālulue faatasi ma isi, faia ni fesili loloto ma le 'ānoa, ma lelei tomiai i feso'ota'iga. O le komiti faafoe e tatau ona paleni o latou tomiai ma potu masani ina ia mautū, talafeagai ma malamalama auā o fuafuaga, māta'itūina o tiute eseese, lipoti ma toe iloilo ina ia mautinoa le solo lelei o faatinoga o galuega a le a'oga. Siaki le upega tafailagi www.trustee-election.co.nz/becoming-a-trustee mo nisi faamatalaga e uiga i le avea ma sui o le komiti faafoe.

O ai e avea ma sui o le komiti faafoe?

O matua, i latou oloo vaai tamaiti, ma sui o tagata lautele e mafai ona faatutū mo le filifiliga o sui o komiti faafoe a a'oga. O le a fiafia lau aoga - e toe sa'ili'i nisi faamatalaga e uiga i le faatūina o oe poo le sa'iliina o se tasi faatu mo le palota.

E faapefea ona filifiliga le komiti faafoe?

O matua ma tagata faigaluega i le a'oga e filifiliga sui mo le komiti faafoe i le faai'uga o le ta'itulu tausaga.

O matua uma o tamaiti oloo 'auai i soo se a'oga e mafai, ma e tatau ona palota i le filifiliga o sui o matua mo le komiti faafoe.

O a ni fesoasoani e maua e sui o komiti faafoe?

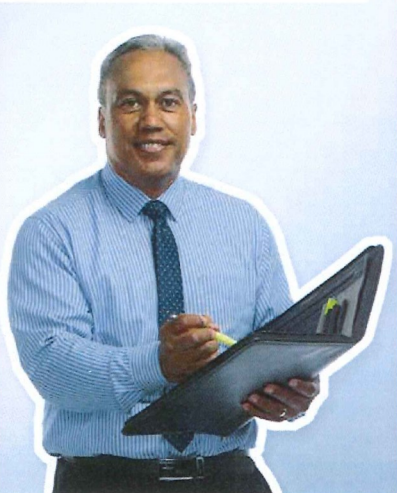

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Ki te whakapiki

He aha rawa tētahi poari kaitiaki kura?

He poari kaitiaki kura tō ia kura, tō ia momo kura puta noa i Aotearoa. Kei ngā mema o ia poari kaitiaki kura ētahi mātua kua pōtīhia, tētahi kaiako kua pōtīhia, me te tumuaki. Mehemea he ākonga tau 9 piki ake o taua kura, ka noho mai hoki tētahi ākonga hei māngai mō ōna hoa-ako.

Ka ahatia te hunga kaitiaki?

Tuatahi rawa mai ka ū ai te poari ki te piki ake o ngā ākonga e ako haere ana me ō rātou mātua tae atu ki te hāpori. Ka mātua pupuri te poari i te mana whakahaere o te kura. Kei roto katoa i ngā tikanga ā-ture te whai pānga ki ngā kaupapa ako, ngā rawa, ngā kaimahi, te whakahaere pūtea, me ngā tūāhau hauora, waiora anō hoki.

E whai ake nei ētahi tino mahi a te poari:

- Ka whakatauria te aronga rautaki me ngā mahere tiro whānui o te kura, me te mea anō ka aroturukinga te anga whakamua o te poari.
- Ka aroturukina, ka aromātaia hoki te piki haere me ngā tutukitanga a ngā ākonga.
- Ka tirohia whānuitia ngā mahi whakahaere i ngā kaimahi, ngā rawa, ngā pūtea, ngā kaupapa ako, me ngā mahi whakahaere pūnaha o ia wā, o ia wā.
- Ka whakapūmautia ki ngā matea ako me ngā tino uaratanga o ngā ākonga Māori, ngā ākonga Pasifika, me ngā ākonga hauā kia āta tāutuhia, kia āta māheretia aua matea, ā, tutuki noa.
- Ka whakatutukinga te tikanga o te Tiriti o Waitangi me te whai uara me te whai whakaaro ki ngā tuku ihotanga o te ahurea kākano-rua.
- Ka waitohua, ka tautokohia hoki te tumuaki me te whakawāriu i āna mahi whakahaere kura.

He aha ngā pūkenga mā te kaitiaki?

Tā te kaitiaki mahi, he kaha arataki i tōna kura me te whai ki te mahi ngātahi, te pātapatāi hāngai atu, me te whakamahi i ōna pūkenga whitiwhiti whakaaro. E tika ana kia whārite ai te hunga whai pūkenga, whai wheako hoki o ngā poari ki te whakaū ki ngā kaupapa mahi mō te taha mahere, turuki, tuku pūrongo, arotake hoki me ngā mahi katoa o te kura.

Ko wai mā hei kaitiaki?

E taea tonutia e ngā mātua, ngā mātua whāngai, me ngā tāngata o te hāpori whānui te kōwhiri ki ngā pōtīhanga mō te poari kaitiaki kura. He koanga ngākau tō te kura ki te whakaatu atu i ngā mōhioranga mōu, mō tētahi atu tangata rānei.

Ka pēhea ngā pōtīhanga mō te poari kaitiaki kura?

Ka tū ake ngā pōtīhanga mō ngā poari kaitiaki kura ia toru tau. He tikanga anō tērā i te noho wātea hei whāi mā ngā mātua katoa o ngā ākonga tūturu ki ō rātou tūmomo kura katoa o te motu i te pōtīhanga kaitiaki mātua ka taea.

He aha ngā kaupapa āwhina mā ngā kaitiaki kura?

Ko tā Te Whakaroputanga Kaitiaki Kura O Aotearoa, nā tētahi kirimana Tāhuhu o te Mātāuranga, he whakarato tohutohu utukore e pā ana ki te tuku mahi me te whakahaeretanga, te tautoko, ngā rauemi hoki. Ko tētahi atu mahi a te NZSTA he whakarato i ngā momo whanaketanga ngaio huhua mā ngā kaitiaki.
